TRANSPORT IN SANTIAGO

Santiago is a very easy city to navigate. It has an integrated system of urban transportation, which was inaugurated in 2008, 120 miles of urban highways cross the city connecting the center with commercial areas and the surrounding neighborhoods, and taxis are cheap.

TAXIS

Taking a taxi in Santiago is safe and relatively cheap. All taxis are metered, with a base price of 300 pesos (about USD 0.50) plus around 100 pesos for each 200 meters driven (or per minute when waiting). Taxis are in abundance throughout the city.

METRO

Santiago's Metro system (SEE MAP) is the most modern and efficient in Latin America, comparable to that of many European cities. Single-journey tickets can be purchased at the ticket booths in each station and cost around US\$ 1.10, although we would recommend buying a 'BIP' card that costs \$1.500 (approximately US\$ 2.00) and is then charged with the desired amount depending.

BUSES

The Santiago bus network is part of the same integrated transport system as the Metro. It requires the use of the aforementioned 'BIP' card. Instructions for getting to and from the conference venue are shown on the next page.

BICYCLE

There are more and more cycle lanes in the city, making this a viable option during your stay.

GETTING TO AND FROM THE SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE VENUE

METRO

The closest Metro stations to the Faculty (on Av. República 779) are Toesca (Line 2) and República (Line 1).

> FROM TOESCA STATION

Find the exit in the western direction and walk seven blocks down the street of the same name as the station until reaching Av. República, where you should turn left and walk three blocks to the corner of Blanco Encalada.

> FROM REPÚBLICA STATION

Find the southern exit (Vereda Sur) and walk eight blocks down the street of the same name as the station until reaching the corner of Blanco Encalada.


BUSES

Transantiago bus routes that pass by the venue are:

- ◆ 506: from Maipú to Peñalolen, that passes down Av. Blanco Encalada. This is useful for those that are coming from Maipú (Av. Pajaritos), Estación Central (Av. 5 de Abril), Santiago Centro (Av. Matta), Ñuñoa (Av. Grecia) and Peñalolén (Av. Grecia).
- ◆ 507: from Pudahuel to Peñalolén, which also goes down Av. Blanco Encalada. Serves those coming from the neighborhoods of Pudahuel (Av. José Joaquín Pérez), Quinta Normal (Av. Mapocho & Av. Matucana), Santiago Centro (Av. España & Av. Matta), Ñuñoa (Av. Grecia) & Peñalolén (Av. Grecia).
